How should we live?
1) Allow God's G to work even more in our lives. (2 Corinthians 12:8-10)
2) God allows us to S so that we can help others through their suffering. (2 Corinthians 1:3-4)
3) Never lose Hope or think that God does not C (1 Peter 5:6-7)
The purpose of miracles
1) To bring G to God. (John 9:3)
2) To further the G message.
3) Out of God's G, love, and purpose for us. (Romans 8:28)
The critical question: <u>Do we trust God?</u>
God's Promises
1) The presence of the Holy Spirit now
2) Life eternal in the future
3) Nothing can separate us from God's love, not even death. Romans 8:37-39
Dealing with the pain of a broken body now
1) The P for healing offered in faith.
2) The peace of God's P when healing does not come as we hoped.
3) The fellowship of other B during our times of suffering.
Jesus suffered with us. (Hebrews 4:14-16)
Our victory comes because of Jesus' death and resurrection. (Isaiah 53:4-5)
Our hope is when Jesus comes. (Revelation 21:4; Romans 8:18)
